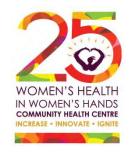

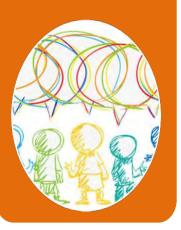

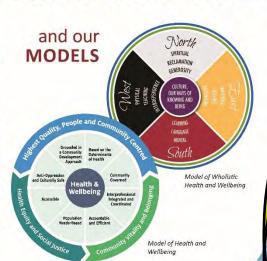

They recently they hired interpreters who speak Czeck/Slovak, Hindi/Gujurati, Arabic/French, Tamil, and Hungarian, based on these statistics.

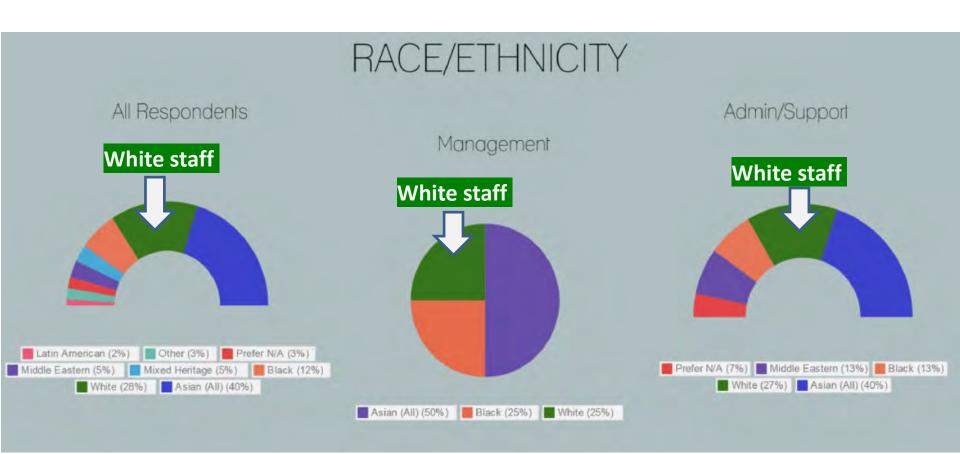
Decrease all forms of organizational discrimination & oppression

Planned Parenthood: Anti-racism, antioppression training for staff in the last year; now required for all new staff.

Somerset West CHC: Diversity audit of the agency; examining internal hiring practices and other HR practices and policies



Access Alliance did an equity survey with employees, which determined staff composition, languages etc.

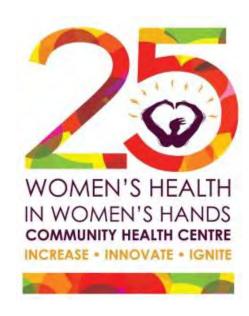

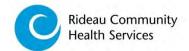

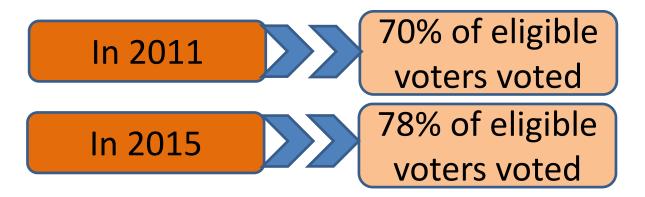
